No matter the teacher, each child is assessed via the same assessment provided by TEKS Resource System which models each assessment after the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or STAAR test. Previous STAAR tests are released which are utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums. Students are tested using MCLASS, MAP, Circle or STAAR interm aassessments. Results are always shared with parents.
