Student Identification (ID) Badge & Dress Code  
Procedures & Consequences  
Spring 2017

Students are required to wear their ID badge and adhere to the Dress Code Policy at all. Students in violation of these policies are subject to the following consequences.

**Procedures for students NOT wearing ID Badges**

- A temporary ID badge will be issued to students without their permanent ID badge upon arrival at the morning entry stations (Bus Ramp, Student Parking Lot & Attendance Office).
- Community Secretaries in the community office after 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Period will issue temporary ID badges.
- After 7:45AM ID badges will be checked at ID station in the Attendance Office.
- **Periodic safety sweeps will be conducted. Any student found not wearing their ID badge around their neck will be subject to immediate placement in In-School-Suspension.**

**Consequences for NOT wearing ID Badges**

- **First offense – Level I Warning # 1**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as a verbal reprimand in eSchool
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
- **Second offense – Level I Warning # 2**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as a verbal reprimand in eSchool
  - Parent phone call made by Community Secretary
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
- **Third offense – Repeated Level I**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as repeated level I offense in eSchool
  - Parent phone call made by Community Secretary
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
  - One day of In-School Suspension
  - Mandatory Parent Conference with Community Leader
- **Fourth offense – Repeated Level I**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as repeated level I offense in eSchool
  - Parent phone call made by Community Secretary
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
  - Two days of In-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
- **Fifth offense– Defiant Behavior**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as defiance of authority in eSchool
  - Parent phone call made by Community Secretary
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
  - One day Out-of-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
  - DAEP Contract
- **Sixth offense and greater– Defiant Behavior**
  - Documented using ID badge log and as defiance of authority in eSchool
  - Parent phone call made by Community Secretary
  - Student issued a temporary ID badge
  - Three day Out-Of-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
  - DAEP Referral
- **Students are subject to non-participation in extracurricular activities if an In-School or Out-of-School Suspension is issued.**

### Procedures for Dress Code Violations

- A temporary Dress Code Violation shirt will be issued at morning entry station (LGI).
- Community Secretaries in the community office after 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Period will issue temporary Dress Code Violation shirts.
- If the dress code violation is determined to be readily corrected, the student will correct and attend class immediately. All other violations will result in immediate placement in In-School-Suspension.
- **In the case of a conflict or disagreement about dress attire, the language of the Parent & Student Handbook will be enforced. The final determination and interpretation will rest with the campus administrator.**

### Consequences for Dress Code Violations

- First offense – Level I Warning # 1
  - Documented using dress code log and as a verbal reprimand in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - Student will be escorted to In-School-Suspension until appropriate clothing is brought to the school by a parent
- Second offense – Level I Warning # 2
  - Documented using dress code log and as a verbal reprimand in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - Student will be escorted to In-School-Suspension until appropriate clothing is brought to the school by a parent
- Third offense – Repeated Level I
  - Documented using dress code log and as repeated level I offense in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - One day of In-School Suspension
  - Mandatory Parent Conference with Community Leader
- Fourth offense – Repeated Level I
  - Documented using dress code log and as repeated level I offense in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - Two days of In-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
- Fifth offense– Defiant Behavior
  - Documented using dress code log and as defiance of authority in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - One day Out-of-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
  - DAEP Contract
- Sixth offense and greater– Defiant Behavior
  - Documented using dress code log and as defiance of authority in eSchool
  - Dress code violators will be issued a dress code violation shirt
  - Dress code violators will call parent to bring appropriate clothes
  - Three day Out-Of-School Suspension
  - Mandatory parent conference with Community Principal
  - DAEP Referral
- **Students are subject to non-participation in extracurricular activities if an In-School or Out-of-School Suspension is issued.**

### Consequences for Backpack and Purse Violations

- First Offense – Backpack, purse, etc. will be collected and stored until the end of the school day
- Second Offense - Backpack, purse, etc. will be collected and a parent must come pick up the confiscated bag(s) as they will not be returned to the student
