Notify parents of the annual meeting using the campus website, emails, Tuesday folders, Blackboard messages, weekly parent newsletter, and the campus marquee. ➤ Hold meetings at a convenient time for parents and encourage student and parent participation. ➤ Ensure that communication to parents is specific, containing all the details pertinent to the event.
