Parents are invited annually to attend a parent meeting to review and revise the document the Parent and Family Engagement Policy. The meetings will be held in September. Parents will be informed of Title One guidelines and their rights as a parent of a student who is served by the Title One program. At each meeting, parents will be encouraged to attend future parent meetings to review and revise the Parent and Family Engagement Policy.
