INTERDISTRICT TRANSFERS

(LOCAL)

AUTHORITY	<p>The Superintendent or designee is authorized to accept or reject any transfer requests, provided that such action is without regard to race, religion, color, sex, disability, national origin, or ancestral language.</p> <p>A resident student in kindergarten–grade 11 who becomes a non-resident during the course of a semester shall be permitted to continue in attendance for the remainder of the semester. A senior student shall be allowed to continue in attendance for his or her senior year in order to graduate.</p> <p>A student who attended a District high school as a sophomore and junior and who becomes a nonresident shall be allowed to continue in attendance for his or her senior year in order to graduate.</p> <p>If a student’s family presents sufficient evidence of intent to establish residence in the District within three months of enrolling the student in the District, the student shall be allowed to enroll.</p>
TRANSFER REQUESTS	<p>A nonresident student wishing to transfer into the District shall file an application for transfer each school year with the Superintendent or designee. Transfers shall be granted for one regular school year at a time.</p>
FACTORS	<p>In approving transfers, the Superintendent or designee shall consider availability of space and instructional staff and the student’s disciplinary history and attendance records.</p>
TRANSFER AGREEMENTS	<p>A transfer student shall be notified in the written transfer agreement that he or she must follow all rules and regulations of the District. Violation of the terms of the agreement may result in a transfer request not being approved the following year.</p>
TUITION	<p>If the District charges tuition, the amount shall be set by the Board, within statutory limits.</p> <p>Tuition rates for each classification of transfer students shall be established by the Board for:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Children of nonresident employees;</li><li>2. Students completing their senior year in the District;</li><li>3. Students in the process of establishing District residency; and</li><li>4. Students who are children of Texas Youth Commission employees.</li></ol>
WAIVERS	<p>The Board may waive tuition for a student based on financial hardship upon written application by the student, parent, or guardian. [See FP]</p>

NONPAYMENT

The District may initiate withdrawal of students whose tuition payments are delinquent.
