#### IV. Presentations

A. Two-Way Dual Language Bilingual Program

Chief Lupita Hinojosa introduced Dr. Virginia Collier and Dr. Wayne Thomas who presented information on their research and the benefits of Two-Way Dual Language Bilingual Programs. The presentation included dual language research, outcomes of well-implemented dual language programs, research showing the cognitive advantages of being bilingual, and long term achievement studies of English learners in dual language programs versus English submersion programs.

- A. Memorandum of Understanding between Texas Department of State Health Services and Spring Independent School District Chief Lupita Hinojosa presented information regarding a Memorandum of Understanding between Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) and Spring Independent School District. The Memorandum of Understanding states that the Texas Department of State Health Services will provide dental services at no cost for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students at Winship Elementary and Cooper Elementary by DSHS regional dentists and dental hygienists, with assistance from the School District's staff.
- B. Acceptance of Grant Funds The Board of Trustees may take action on this item. Chief Lupita Hinojosa presented information regarding the acceptance of proposed grant funds in the amount of \$348,900 from the American Association of School Administrators an National Joint Powers Alliance, Hurricane Harvey Relief Fund managed by the Greater Houston Community, and The Simmons Foundation.
